THE PROGRAM: NEW FOR 2021

In-Person or Live Virtual Presentations

The Internet Crimes against Children (ICAC) Youth Educators Program, provided by the Indiana State Police (ISP), provides over 500 presentations a year, to over 200,000 children in Indiana schools, churches and youth organizations. These assembly-style presentations provide age appropriate, timely information, relevant to youth ages 8 to 18. Presentations focus on information and education to help children understand the challenges of being online.

Grades 3-5: This presentation includes information gathered from NetSmartz and the Indiana ICAC Task Force and addresses:

- What is inappropriate content
- What is personal information
- Why to never agree to meet face-to-face with someone they've met online
- How to address cyber bullying

**PLEASE NOTE, the 3rd grade program is not the same as 5th grade, neither is the MS program the same as HS.*

***Middle and High School:** This presentation addresses the safe use of all devices and websites, no matter how kids access the Internet, and is specifically designed to educate in the areas of:

- Sexual solicitation
- Child extortion, also known as sextortion
- Production of child pornography
- Cyberbullying
- Sexting

Presentations last approximately one hour but are highly customizable.

Additional presentations are available for adults, parents, educators, youth workers and community leaders. The ISP offers Digital Safety Presentations at no cost to Indiana organizations as a public service.

Each presentation is 1-hour, unless otherwise specified during the scheduling process. That time is from start of presentation to end. It is important to factor in additional time for seating and dismissal in your scheduling. Please inform your front desk/receptionist we are coming to avoid any confusion when we arrive.

Please allow enough travel time for in-person visits, both to locations and in between presentations. (i.e., Distance and traffic to locations, moving groups in and out of presentation locations, time for questions/interviews, etc.) If you are scheduling on behalf of an organization and may not be present the day of the event, be sure the organization and day of contact person are aware of our visit.

Recording of the presentation is strictly prohibited. We cannot share copies of our presentations/PowerPoints. However, we do have brochures and handouts that can be shared freely to all who are interested. We are willing to do interviews and speak to the News media, with advanced notice.

As we are grant funded, we have requirements we must adhere to, including audience make-up, presentation times, interviews, and recording programs.
